8. Basis for Award	An award will be made to the responsible bidder whose bid is responsive to the terms of the RFQ and is most advantageous to DAI, considering price or/and other factors included in the RFQ. To be considered for award, bidders must meet the requirements identified in Section 12, “Determination of Responsibility”. No discussions or negotiations are permitted with bidders, and therefore bidders shall submit their best and final price.

Questions Regarding the RFQ</p>	<p>Each Bidder is responsible for reading very carefully and understanding fully the terms and conditions of this RFQ. All communications regarding this solicitation must be submitted via email (<b>FtF_Procurement@dai.com</b>). All questions received will be compiled and answered in writing and distributed to all interested Bidders.</p>
<p>11. Technical Specifications and requirements for Technical Acceptability</p>	<p><b>Unarmed security services are required 24 hours per day, 7 days per week throughout the entire year. One security officer is required to meet the TOR described below.</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• 24h Control of public access to the premises Human and Property security;</li> <li>• Non-project vehicle access control;</li> <li>• Inspection, detection and investigation of all security-related incidents;</li> <li>• Respond promptly and appropriately to all security-related emergencies;</li> <li>• Security officers shall be equipped with portable communication devices permitting 24-hour communication;</li> <li>• The Security Guard should be wearing company designed uniform at all the time.</li> <li>• Check ID of all non-staff members who enters the premises during the normal working and record entries and exits on daily report document;</li> <li>• Not allowing non staff members to the premises after working hours and weekends unless previously authorized by the project office responsible;</li> <li>• Perform any other related security duties.</li> </ul>
<p>12. Determination of Responsibility</p>	<p>DAI will not enter any type of agreement with a vendor prior to ensuring the vendor’s responsibility. When assessing a vendor’s responsibility, the following factors are taken into consideration:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Provide copies of the required business licenses to operate in the host country.</li> <li>2. The source, origin and nationality of the services are not from a Prohibited Country (explained below).</li> <li>3. Ability to comply with required or proposed delivery or performance schedules.</li> <li>4. Service start required as soon as the company is awarded.</li> </ol>
<p>13. Geographic Code</p>	<p><b>Under the authorized geographic code for its contract DAI may only procure goods and services from the following countries.</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Geographic Code 935: Goods and services from any area or country including the cooperating country, but excluding Prohibited Countries.</li> <li>• DAI must verify the source, nationality and origin of services and ensure (to the fullest extent possible) that DAI does not procure any services from prohibited countries listed by the Office of Foreign Assets Control (OFAC) as sanctioned countries. The current list of countries under</li> </ul>

	<p>comprehensive sanctions include: <b>Cuba, Iran, North Korea, Sudan, and Syria.</b> DAI is prohibited from facilitating any transaction by a third party if that transaction would be prohibited if performed by DAI.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• By submitting a quote in response to this RFQ, Bidders confirm that they are not violating the Source and Nationality requirements and that the services comply with the Geographic Code and the exclusions for prohibited countries.</li> </ul>
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<p>14. Data Universal Numbering System (DUNS)</p>	<p>All U.S. and foreign organizations which receive first-tier subcontracts/ purchase orders with a value of \$25,000 and above <b>are required</b> to obtain a DUNS number prior to signing of the agreement. Organizations are exempt from this requirement if the gross income received from all sources in the previous tax year was under \$300,000. <p>15. Compliance with Terms and Conditions</p>	<p>Bidder shall be aware of the general terms and conditions for an award resulting from this RFQ. The selected Bidder shall comply with all Representations and Certifications of Compliance listed in <b>Attachment B.</b></p>
<p>16. Procurement Ethics</p>	<p>By submitting a Bidder, Bidders certify that they have not/will not attempt to bribe or make any payments to DAI employees in return for preference, nor have any payments with Terrorists, or groups supporting Terrorists, been attempted. Any such practice constitutes an unethical, illegal, and corrupt practice and either the Bidders or the DAI staff may report violations to the Toll-Free</p>

### 1.2 Attachment B: Representations and Certifications of Compliance

1. Federal Excluded Parties List - The Bidder Select is not presently debarred, suspended, or determined ineligible for an award of a contract by any Federal agency.
2. Executive Compensation Certification- FAR 52.204-10 requires DAI, as prime contractor of U.S. federal government contracts, to report compensation levels of the five most highly compensated subcontractor executives to the Federal Funding Accountability and Transparency Act Sub-Award Report System (FSRS)

7. Prohibition of Segregated Facilities - The Bidder certifies that it is compliant with FAR 52.222-21, Prohibition of Segregated Facilities.
8. Equal Opportunity – The Bidder certifies that it does not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of age, sex, religion, handicap, race, creed, color or national origin.

9. Labor Laws – The Bidder certifies that it is in compliance with all labor laws.
10. Federal Acquisition Regulation (FAR) – The Bidder certifies that it is familiar with the Federal Acquisition Regulation (FAR) and is in not in violation of any certifications required in the applicable clauses of the FAR, including but not limited to certifications regarding lobbying, kickbacks, equal employment opportunity, affirmation action, and payments to influence Federal transactions.

Employee Compliance – The Bidder warrants that it will require all employees, entities and individuals providing services in connection with the performance of an DAI Purchase Order to comply with the provisions of the resulting Purchase Order and with all Federal, State, and local laws and regulations in connection with the work associated therein.
